Minnesota Transfer Currriculum (MNTC) 2023-2024

This 40-credit course curriculum includes completion of the 10 goal areas that transfer to most MN State colleges and universities. The MNTC help develop key communication and critical thinking skills and exposes students to new and diverse ideas. The MNTC is a stackable credential that students can use as a basis for further academic studies.

- 1. Apply Foundational skills needed for the future of their education, work, and life that supports economic and social mobility.
- 2. Demonstrate knowledge of the physical and natural world through scientific and quantitative reasoning skills.
- 3. Explain the nature of human behaviors, beliefs, and experiences on an individual, social, and cultural level to support their equitable participation in society.
