Health programs have specific requirements for students to complete.

Paramedicine Program Description

The Paramedicine Program is a full-time program that begins each fall semester. The Paramedicine program is 4 semesters:

- Fall semester 1
- Spring semester 2
- Summer semester 3
- Fall semester 4

The Paramedicine program welcomes 20 students each fall semester.

The students must earn the MN EMSRB Certification prior to acceptance to the program. SCTCC offers courses to prepare for this certification.

Paramedics are faced with initiating care to acutely ill and injured patients in limited conditions. Lifesaving procedures and decisions are determined in an instant. Graduates of the paramedicine program receive a high level of training to provide advanced care through medications and invasive procedures in the pre-hospital and hospital environment.

Paramedicine Careers

Career choices include Paramedic, Emergency Department Technician, and Flight Paramedic. <u>Potential employers include</u> ambulance services, hospitals and urgency rooms, flight services (helicopter and airplane) event coverage industry and city health agencies, fire departments and law enforcement agencies. Paramedics also can incorporate their training in career fields like park services and ski patrol.

- The three-year placement rate for the Paramedicine program is 100%.
- The average Central MN annual salary range is \$40k to 54k.

Prospective/Returning Student - Application Process

- Your first step is to apply to SCTCC as a Pre-Paramedicine student at https://sctcc.edu/apply
- Follow instructions received by Admissions and Records & Registration offices.
- Meet with an advisor to begin the *Current SCTCC Student* process.

Current SCTCC Student / Advisor Meetings - Academic Advising Center

- Current SCTCC students are required to meet with an advisor at least once a semester to receive a registration access code and review their academic plan.
- We encourage students to visit more often with any questions or concerns they may have.

Paramedicine Program Requirements

Students must earn MN EMSRB Certification prior to acceptance to the Paramedicine program.

- Email <u>paramedicine@sctcc.edu</u> the following information:
 - Provide MN EMSRB certification card or number.
 - o Include your name and SCTCC Student ID or Star ID.
- Once verified, student will be notified of acceptance to the Paramedicine program.
- 20 students accepted to the Paramedicine program each fall semester.
- There is **NOT** a 2nd application to the Paramedicine program, follow the email instructions.

Licensing Exam

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Graduates of the Paramedicine program will receive an Associate of Applied Science Degree and are Eligible to take the National Registry exam for paramedics upon completion.

St Cloud Technical & Community College is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission.



Students admitted to the Paramedicine program

Students will be notified of the date and time for the mandatory Paramedicine student orientation, usually held in June.

Students will be required to take and pass (paid for by the student):

- a MN Criminal Background study,
- electronic fingerprinting AND
- drug testing

In addition, the following must be completed:

- A medical examination,
- vaccinations against Hepatitis B or signed release form,
- Mantoux test

A driving background study may be conducted each fall for all students to operate State of MN vehicles.
