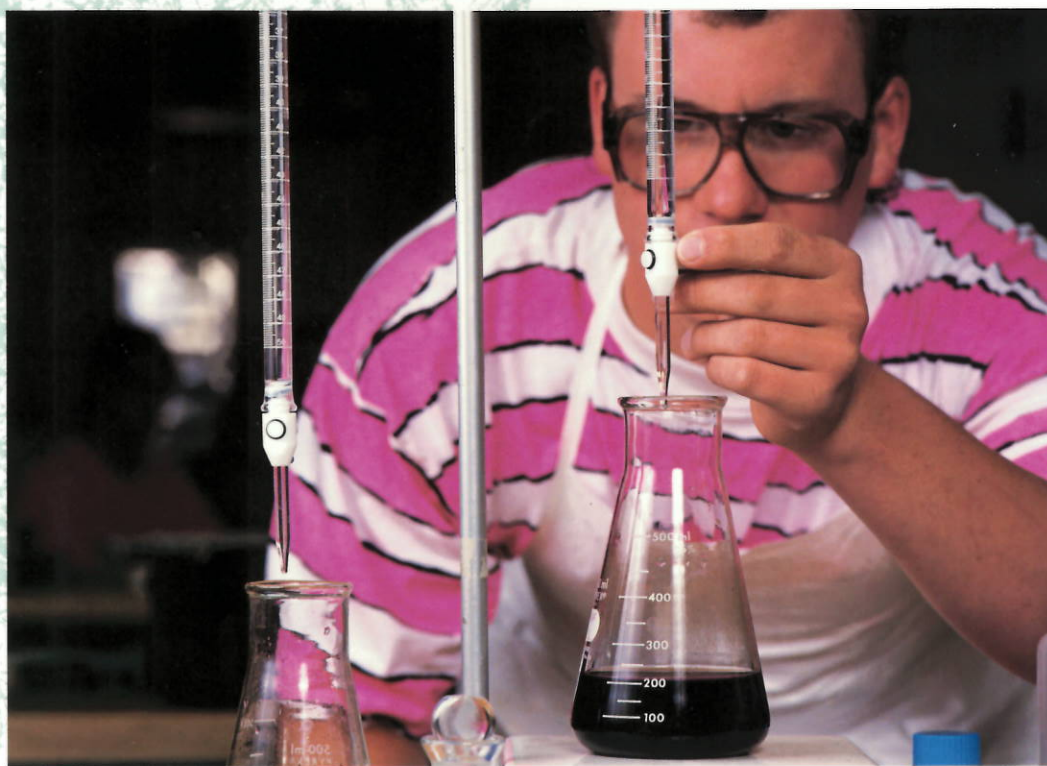

T UITION AND FINANCIAL AID

Affordable Education

The Minnesota State Legislature sets the tuition cost each year. In 1990-91, the cost per credit is \$33.25 for In-State Residents. Approximately 80% of our students receive financial aid in forms of grants, scholarships, loans, or the student work study program. Our Placement Office can help you find part-time work to help with school expenses. You also have the option to attend classes part-time or full-time.

Financial aid is designed to help make up the difference between the cost of attendance and the ability to pay. A student's financial need is calculated using the information provided on an application form called the Family Financial Statement (FFS), available from the Financial Aid Office.

Our Placement Office offers a variety of services to help students and graduates realize their career objectives. We provide job seeking assistance from writing a winning resume to handling difficult questions during an interview. Openings for full-time and part-time positions are posted daily in the office. Our annual job fair attracts more than 150 employers to meet with SCTC students. We process an average of 3000 job openings each year. 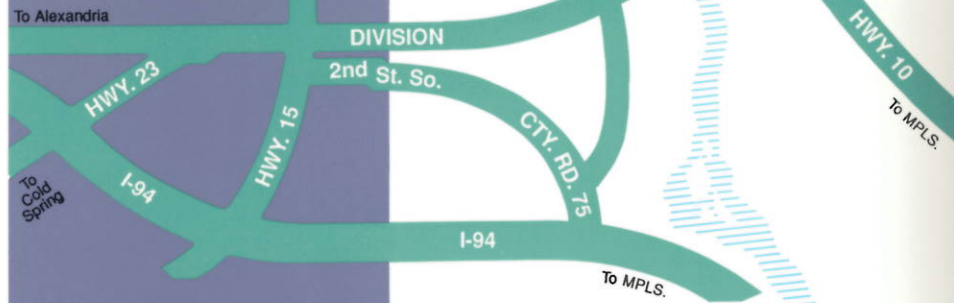
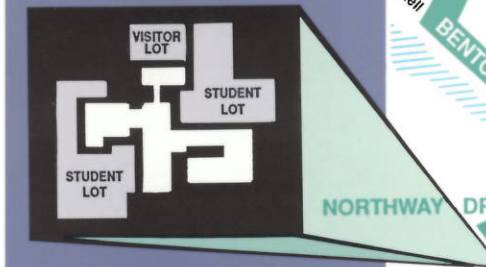
We're Just A Stone's Throw Away

St. Cloud is located just an hour from the Twin Cities and minutes away from Minnesota's famed lake region.

The City's Metro Bus System provides convenient service from our front door to all parts of the City. If you prefer to drive, you can find ample free parking on campus. As a matter of fact, the maximum commuting time to school, to work or to shop is about 20 minutes within the City.

Helpful Information To Plan Your Career

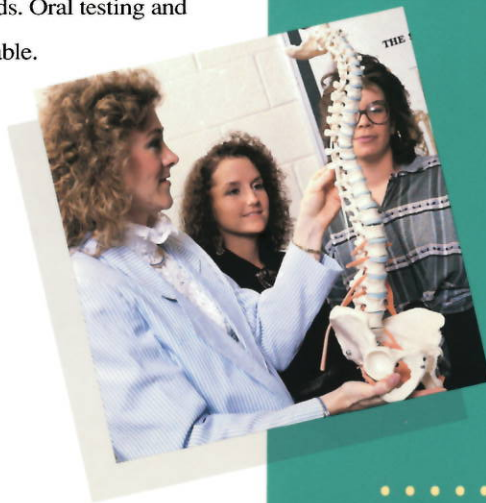
Our counselors can help you identify your interests, aptitudes and skills to decide the best career choice for you. We also have the most up-to-date computer resources to give you current information on careers.
